# **About This Manual**

# Who should use this manual . . .

This manual contains the step-by-step procedures needed by the person responsible for both installing and checking out features on the System/36. These steps enable the user to install features and then to test operations. No tools or special skills are required.

# How this manual is arranged . . .

Sections 1 through 4 present the steps required to install and test each new feature. Section 5 contains information for operating the configure - customize program. And Section 6 contains information for problem determination.

Note: This publication follows the convention that he means he or she.

# What you should know . . .

No previous data processing or computer experience is required to install new features on the System/36. When you have completed the installation of your feature for your system, read *Performing the First System Configuration for Your System*, SC21-9022 or *Changing Your System Configuration*, SC21-9052.

# If you need more information . . .

If you need more information about installing features see *What To Do Before Your Computer Arrives,* SBOF-4778.

If you need information about system reference codes, see System Messages, SC21-7938.



# How to Use This Manual

Each step that you perform is identified with two numbers. The first number identifies the section and the second number identifies the step within that section.



When you complete a step, go to the next step.



Some steps will ask you questions. Depending on how you answer the question, you might not always go to the next step.



Words and art that appear to the right of each step are additional information you might need to complete the task. Always read the information in the step first and then the additional information.

#### Additional Information for 1.3



Sometimes this manual will use the words work station. Work station means either a printer or display station.

A symbol that appears in the text like **3.2** is pointing toward another step.

This means go to Section 3, step 2.

An arrow like is used to point out or locate something on the art.

A broken arrow like is used to show action such as push, pull, turn, go to, and so on.

A small hand like is used to show location and a pressing action.

**Note:** To avoid problems during feature installation, you should follow the instructions in this manual step-by-step. If you encounter a problem, instructions near the steps tell you what to do.



# Section 1: Before Installing A New Feature



Form C1 should have been completed using Task 3.5 in workbook 3, *Planning to Set Up Your Computer.* SA21-9476. Form C1 tells you which feature(s) you have to install.

### CAUTION:

Feature cards can be damaged if dropped or stepped on.

CAUTION:

The feature card is sensitive to static electricity and can be damaged if the humidity is below 40%.

You will be using three diskettes.

#### Notes:

- If you are setting up your computer for the first time and if you are adding a feature, use diskettes 1, 2, and 3 that come with the computer.
- If you are upgrading your computer by adding a feature only, use diskettes 1, 2, and 3 that come from the Programming Information Department (PID). PID is an IBM group responsible for distributing diskettes with each release. Always use the latest level of diskettes from PID.

If you are installing the feature on an operating System/36, check with the system operator to make sure that all jobs have been completed before turning off the computer.

An operating System/36 is a system that is set up and is processing data for your business.

## 1.3

### Turn off the computer.

a. Press the Select Function key until 🔓 appears.



b. Press the Start Function key.



Make sure the security lock is in the Service position. If the security lock is not in the Service position, turn it to the Service position, as shown in **2.7**. The security lock is in the Service position when the triangle and the notch in the key are pointing toward the Service position.



The Select Function key automatically advances the numbers (1 through 9) and letters (A through F) until you release the key.

**Note:** Letters b and d are displayed in lower case, as shown:



If you go beyond the number 6, keep pressing the Select Function key until it shows up again.

The **b** will flash to indicate that the computer is turning off.

Each feature will be installed one at a time. If you have more than one feature to install, begin from left to right. For example, if you are installing the Work Station feature only, go to 3.1 and begin.

If you are unsure about which feature to install, see Form C1.



# Section 2: Installing The Main Storage Feature





The  $\mathbf{X}$  card (that is next to the orange card) might be in slots 2, 3, or 4.

The  $\mathbf{X}$  card is a blank card that might be removed to make room for the feature card. The  $\mathbf{X}$  card can be thrown away.



## CAUTION:

Do not touch any metal part on the card to prevent possible damage to the card. Handle the card only by the plastic edges.

# Section 3. Installing The Work Station Feature



- You have only one feature card to install.
- The Work Station feature when installed will increase the number of work stations that can be attached to your computer, from 6 to 22.
- The Work Station feature card comes in a separate box. You can identify the card by the blue label printed on the box.





The card must be removed to make room for the feature card that is now in slot 2. Do not throw away the card.



Be careful not to damage the Work Station feature Card.

You need to pull this Card harder when you remove it than when you remove a X card.

You will be inserting the card in slot 1 in step 3.4

# **Section 4: Installing A Communications Feature**





If you are installing communications for the first time, install the SLCA or MLCA feature first.



The  $\mathbf{X}$  card is a blank card that must be removed to make room for the feature card. The  $\mathbf{X}$  card can be thrown away.



The SLCA card is in a box that looks like the following example.





The wrap connector will be stored in your computer later in this section. It is used by your service representative.



The feature card will not snap into place unless you press hard. The card will not break.





The X card, if you removed one, can be thrown away.

The yellow SLCA card, if you removed one, should be kept. You need to pull this card harder when you remove it than when you remove an card.



The MLCA card is in a box that looks like the following example:





The wrap connector will be stored in your computer later in this section. It is used by your service representative.



The feature card will not snap into place unless you press hard. The card will not break.















You should record the line number on the feature card.





The part number on the cable should match the part number recorded on Form C1.

# Section 5: Telling Your Computer about the New Feature

## 5.1

The computer will not recognize the new feature until information about the feature is loaded into the computer. This process is called configure-customize and is the last step in the feature installation process.

To perform configure-customize, you will need diskettes 2 and 3.

Because of the way the computer processes the information, you will be inserting and removing the same diskettes twice.

The entire configure-customize process will take about 15 minutes.

## Appendix A. Removing or Changing a Feature

# A.1

The computer will not recognize a removed or a changed feature until information about the change is loaded into the computer. This process is called configure-customize and must be performed when you remove or change a feature.

To perform configure-customize, you will need the latest level of diskettes 1, 2, and 3.

Because of the way the computer processes the information, you will be inserting and removing the same diskettes twice.

The entire configure-customize process will take about 15 minutes.

If you are removing or changing a feature on an operating System/36, check with the system operator to make sure that all jobs have been completed before turning off the computer. An operating System/36 is a system that is set up and is processing data for your business.
